11:15 Start **Rancho Simi Valley Community Park**, 1692 Sycamore Dr., Simi Valley – only 5 tables (seat 30-40 participants). We will all enjoy a good ole’ picnic lunch. Pack your own brown bag or stop and buy lunch to go at any nearby eatery.
Consider “The Hat Restaurant”, located at 1308 E. Los Angeles Ave., Simi Valley for Pastrami, Hamburger Sandwiches, or Hot Dogs ... the Onion Rings are fantastic! Say “Hi” to the Manager, Octavio, and sponsor of our Car Show 3 times.

Don’t forget to bring your cell phones and a camera. Bring your children with you, if you like.

12:15 depart for “Gardens of the World”. Directions will be handed out at the picnic.

12:45 2nd Stop Stroll through the beautiful “**Gardens of the World**”, 2001 Thousand Oaks Blvd, T.O. Limited handicapped parking available, but you would do well to find parking on T.O. Blvd or at one of several businesses next door. Check in at the office to take pictures. (No charge attraction)

1:30 depart for “Paramount Ranch”

2:00 3rd Stop **Paramount Ranch Historic Western Movie Town.** Cornell Rd. & Mulholand Hwy. For 25 years actors practiced their art here: Bob Hope, Gary Cooper, Claudette Colbert. (No charges & No vendors)...on your own. Here is where you wear your cowboy hat and other western clothes...huge photo opportunities and lots of memories.

3:00 depart for “Lake Enchanto State Park”

3:10 4th Stop **The Peter Strauss Ranch/Lake Enchanto State Park.** Troutdale Rd. & Mulholand. The former home of Peter Strauss, the movie actor. “Rich Man, Poor Man” was a TV mini-series in which he starred. Johnny Cash, Willie Nelson, and the Mandrell Sisters performed here. Visitors enjoy looking at the beautiful surroundings and taking photos. (No charge attraction)

3:30 5th Stop **Cornell Winery & Tasting Room.** (Across from Peter Strauss Ranch) Wine tasting (Not Free), art exhibits, and movie set. Thirst an advantage. Appetizers are available. There is outside seating for children (law prohibits children inside), smokers, and those who simply want to enjoy the fresh mountain air.

4:30 6th Stop Optional: “**The Old Place**” – historic movie set and restaurant. (Next door to Wine Tasting) This building is over 100 years old and features a very long western tavern bar, giant booths, and excellent menu. Sometimes, local performers drop in and entertain.

Appetizers (4:30 p.m.): Choices - Seafood Chowder, Calamari, Clams, Meat & Cheese Tray
Dinner (5:00 p.m.): Choose from - Sirloin Steak, Chicken Dinner, Stew, Grilled Vegetable Salad, Salmon, and Pork (*Limited seating, so must know how many plan to stay. Probably pricey for most children*)

NOTE: “The Rock Store”- Located on Mulholand Hwy, Cornell, CA - 5 mins. From “The Old Place”. It is also a restaurant, movie set, motorcycle hangout and souvenir store (parking limited)

Sometime before or after dinner participants will depart. All will have a great time, bellies will be happily filled, Mustangs will be smiling, and participants will tell stories of this event to their grandchildren.
